



THE FREDONIA PAGEANT

When the curtain opens on the Annunciation Scene of the Christmas Pageant in Fredonia this December, 1982, it will mark the forty-eighth annual presentation of a most unique production. Back in 1935, school superintendent H. F. Wilson, together with teacher Mrs. Cora Ditto worked out an idea for a short nativity play to be given by a few grade school students. Today, far from being the usual make-shift Christmas "program", the Fredonia Pageant is near professional in all phases: stage settings, costumes, lighting, dialogue and music.

According to records at hand, the first nativity play in 1935* was only a part of the entire evenings' program at the school that year. The first three grades presented a "Winter Carnival", the junior high grades sang carols, Santa Claus also appeared. The music teacher, Miss Fowler was the director, with some assistance from women's clubs and others of the community.

However, that same year, the Fredonia Little Theatre Guild presented a Christmas play, "The Star Gleams" in the brand-new auditorium. In this performance, Joseph is played by Francis Cunningham, Mary by Ruth Coon (now Mrs. Cunningham), the shepherds were Bill Dunham, Warren Edmundson and Foster Davis. An adult choir under the direction of Fred Rettig provided the music.

It is not until 1938 that the first all-religious, all-school pageant was given with Mrs. Ditto's script and scenes. However, for several years more, until 1949, Fredonia's adult musicians assisted. Among them were Bill Dunham, Irene Akin, Faye Beal and Fred Retting. Helen Lutes (now Mrs. Dunham) who was then secretary to the Supt. Wilson. was pianist.

Each year it has grown in size, in beauty and in meaning. Now, today, the pageant cast includes nearly one thousand students, all proud to be a part of it: the verse-speaking choir, the choral groups, the brass choir, and especially the pageant itself. To be chosen to portray Mary or Joseph or Herod the King is a coveted honor; and many a little girl has shed tears over the chance to be in the Tableau of Angels. There have been but a few changes in the scenes, perhaps the most controversial being the removal of dancing girls from the court of King Herod. The music, prepared many weeks in advance, includes several songs heard nowhere else in the country, their true origin lost in the years. the "lines" as written by Mrs. Ditto are dearly familiar to all.

Each year, it is the same beautiful, never-to-be-forgotten experience bringing to Fredonians for a brief while, something apart from the jangle and tinsel of an hectic outside world. Once again the brass choir will strike up the processional "O Come All Ye Faithful". From then on, the doors of the auditorium will be closed, with no interruptions, no applause, only the smooth flow of the story, the songs, the six beautiful scenes; until the horns announce "Joy to the World".

And so the Fredonia tradition goes on, thanks to the vision of two teachers, and the dedicated labors of those who followed.
